**Pastor's Corner**

Beautiful is the earth” ( melody of “beautiful Savior”). About this hymn Bishop Ludwig, Ålborg, wrote: "It sparkles and rays of light. Not a shadow can be found in it. Not a stone on the road. Not an idea of something dark and ugly. The earth is beautiful, and God's heaven is wonderful . The road between them goes through "earthly kingdoms" and we walk that path "with the song."  
Even the hard reality of death is only sensed as a part of the great progression towards the goal. "But we can sing like that today?

It is understandable that Ingemann could sing like this.  
His life quietly passed without any greater sorrows or tribulations, as a child’s safe life, and he even lived this idyllic life in one of Denmark's most beautiful regions, in the beautiful old town of Sorø.  
In his mouth these words for sure were real.  
But times have changed since then. Earth is not beautiful anymore, at least that is how many will think when singing this old hymn.  
But are we right when thinking like that? The story of the hymn may shed some light on this question?

Its history began in Germany, where it actually was completely forgotten for a long time until the German hymnologist Heinrich Hoffmann von Fallersleben in the late 18th century decided to travel through Silesia to track down the old, half-forgotten folk songs that once existed among the peasants.

The results were published in 1842 under the Title “Silesian folk songs with melodies”, and in that publication was this wonderful melody of ‘Beautiful is the Earth'.  
The song was thought originally, to be an ancient medieval song which pilgrims had sung on their travel to the Holy Land.  
Pastor Fenger, a good friend of B.S. Ingemann saw in 1850 the hymn in a German magazine and was captivated by its melody.

He showed it to Ingeman and asked him to write "some good Danish words" to the melody and a few days after Ingemann sent Fenger this well-known little poem of three verses, based on the angels singing Christmas night to the shepherds in the fields of Bethlehem. "Glory to God in the highest, peace on Earth and good will toward men."

Very beautiful and idyllic, indeed, but it must not be forgotten that, in the very days when Ingemann wrote the hymn, the idyll was broken in Denmark - in Sorø, as well. The first war of Schleswig was in full swing, and along the roads columns of soldiers were seen heading towards an uncertain fate, while people stood in fear and hope and waved goodbye. Then came the Battle of Isted, July 25 1850, with the loss of 862 young Danish men and 2362 wounded, it is one of the bloodiest battles in the history of Denmark.

Ingemann is believed to have composed the words a few days after this battle. Although Denmark won a victory at Isted; it was a dearly-bought victory. And war seldom causes anything but hate, fear, resentment, despair, suffering and loss. Under these impressions Ingeman found in the angelic Christmas tiding of peace on earth an outlet for what he felt and what he thought the Danes needed to hear.

So the hymn is far from an idyllic embellishment, but it is a message, a gospel in a dark and heavy time.

It doesn't speak about peace in general, peace between nations, but about God's peace in the midst of struggle. It is the gospel to a sinful earth and a fallen race.

Therefore, we can confidently go on singing:  
Beautiful is the earth!  
Wonderful God's heaven!  
Lovely the path that we walk along!  
Souls on the pilgrim way  
through earthly kingdoms  
we go to Paradise with song.  
Even today where, among many others around the world, 9.5 million Syrians are fleeing the civil war in their country and a terrorist organization like ISIS is trying to seize the world's attention by spreading terror, death and destruction.

The hymn was also a clear winner among the 10 most popular hymns when in 2000 an inter-Scandinavian study of the most popular hymns was made.

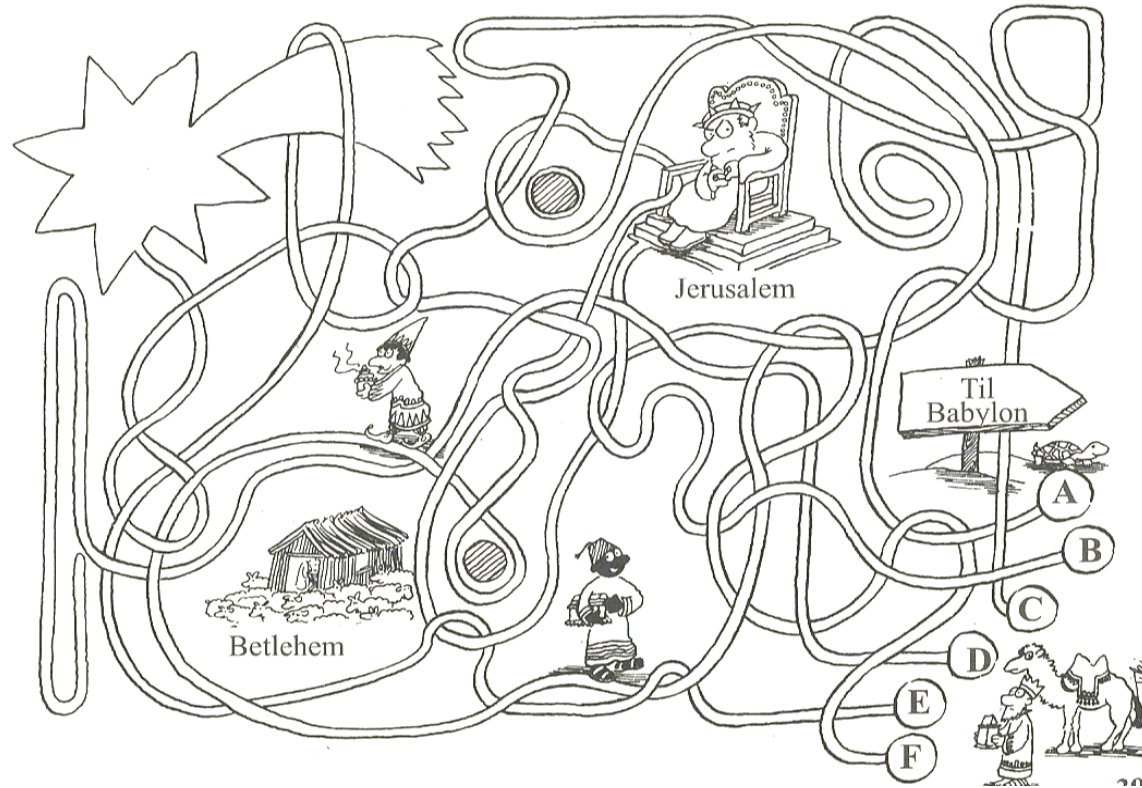
