Pastor's Corner

What are we going to ask for in our prayers? Why engage ourselves in practices like praying at all? Is it in order to change God? Is it to change ourselves? Or to change what is happening in the world?

In different cultures and religions prayers are regarded as magic words—a kind of “open sesame!”—for influencing the divine powers. Those kind of prayers are clearly rejected by Jesus of Nazareth. We are not going to be heard because of our many prayers because God already knows what we need and in his goodness He wants to give us good gifts. Martin Luther put it as follows: “The fewer words the better the prayer!” and he adds: “One must pray shortly, but often and powerfully!” Perhaps prayers are taking up too much space in a Christian service? When we eventually leave the church after a regular morning service nine prayers would have been said or sung. At that point we might not be very Lutheran.

Jesus too rejected many words, but he also taught us to pray often and powerfully like the man who pestered his neighbor for bread, and the widow, who kept on bothering the unjust judge (Luke 11:5-8; 18:1-8). It does not take long to say a prayer, but it takes a long time to listen for God's answer, because the way God grants us a prayer request often crosses our expectations. Therefore prayers teach us “to wait for the Lord more patiently than watchmen for the

morning,” as it says in the Old Testament in Psalm 130. Praying is about finding the will of God so that our own will is changed when we bow before God. Soren Kierkegaard says it this way: “The function of prayer is not to influence God, but rather to change the nature of the one who prays.” Just like the stressed pastor who once asked: “Lord, make me into a patient man, but do it fast!”

An American woman has formed the following prayer: “We pray for children who put chocolate fingers everywhere, who like to be tickled, who stomp in puddles and ruin their new pants, who sneak Popsicles before supper, who erase holes in math workbooks, who can never find their shoes. And we pray for those who stare at photographers from behind barbed wire, who can't bound in the street in a new pair of sneakers, who never go to the circus, who live in an X-rated world. We pray for children who bring us sticky kisses and fistfuls of dandelions, who sleep with the dog and bury the goldfish, who hug us in a hurry and forget their lunch money, who cover themselves with Band-Aids and sing off-key, who squeeze toothpaste all over the sink, who slurp their soup. And we pray for those who never get dessert, who have no safe blanket to drag behind them, who watch their parents watch them die, who can't find any bread to steal, who don't have any rooms to clean up, whose pictures aren't on anybody's dresser, whose monsters are real. We pray for children who spend all their allowance before Tuesday, who throw

tantrums in the grocery store and pick at their food, who like ghost stories, who shove dirty clothes under the bed and never rinse the tub, who get visits from the tooth fairy, who don't like to be kissed in front of the carpool, who squirm in church and scream in the phone, whose tears we sometimes laugh at, and whose smiles can make us cry.

We pray for those whose nightmares come in the daytime, who will eat anything, who aren't spoiled by anybody, who go to bed hungry and cry themselves to sleep, and who live and move, but have no being. We pray for children who want to be carried and for those who must, for those we never give up on and for those who don't get a second chance. For those we smother...and for those who will grab the hand of anybody kind enough to offer it."

To pray is not just about having one's own wishes and needs fulfilled. Christian prayer reaches far wider, even though it is also about going into one's room and there have a conversation with God. Our prayer could be formed like Blaise Pascal did it in 1600 with the following words: "I ask you neither for health nor for sickness, for life nor for death; but that you may dispose of my health and my sickness, my life and my death, for your glory. You alone know what is expedient for me, Amen." Every Christian is chained to praying. Not in the sense of shackles or a nuisance, which we preferably get over in a hurry, but in the sense of a sanctuary, an oasis, an opportunity to hold a conversation with God. Praying is the words of Jesus: "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you (Matt 7:7)" put into practice!

May the summer refresh you and fill you with joy and energy!

Mission Moments

Our small Sunday School meets twice a month during the school year. During Sunday School time there is a small collection taken. The nickels, dimes, quarters, loonies and toonies (and sometimes bigger gifts) all add up. The children select a project on which to spend their collection money and then keep on collecting money until they have the needed amount. Over the years the collection has paid for sweaters for Sunday School children in 2 small churches in the Himalayan region of India, chickens for poor families, a bicycle for a rural health worker, bees and a hive for a small farmer, anti-malarial mosquito nets, money to send a girl to school, a barnyard of small animals for a family, and even a well for a poor village in Ethiopia. Some items were inexpensive while others were more expensive (eg. the well cost over \$1000). But, with time and determination (and sometimes a bit of help from a few grownups) the money has been

Missions Abroad

I am sure some of you remember Janet Sing who was part of our congregation at Sharon Lutheran, and the Chinese congregation Hosanna, some years ago—some of her family is still part of the Hosanna congregation. This is an update on her work in the mission field and prayer requests for her and the ministry:

Janet is in Guatemala currently and has been, on-and-off for a time, mainly serving the Chinese community. There is a Chinese Alliance church, but no Chinese pastor. Pastor Rueben Arias is a Spanish speaking pastor and he does not know English nor Chinese. Janet helps in the Sunday services preaching in Chinese for the Chinese congregation as well as to the Spanish-speaking second generation. Janet is also involved in visitation and outreach to the local Chinese community. This is her focus because she does not speak Spanish. Previously, Janet was also in Paris for six years, involved in planting a Mandarin-speaking congregation, and doing outreach to students from China and Taiwan. Janet started a small bible study group and a discipleship ministry. Last year Janet was in Aruba assisting the local pastor to teach Sunday school with preaching and other duties. Janet's mission ministry is mainly in preaching, teaching, discipleship, evangelism to non-believers. This often involves counselling. People can't find meaning in life unless they find Christ, the Light of Life and our Saviour.

Janet asks for our prayers. It's not a very safe place where she is in Guatemala with so much crime in the city. The apartment she lives in has no telephone line, no TV, and no kitchen. Janet goes to the church kitchen to cook and there is a church phone in the pastor's office or in the kitchen of the church if she needs a phone. She is thankful they have wifi internet access, though often the

signal is weak and disconnects abruptly.

Please pray for her health and for the people she serves to continue to come to know the Lord Jesus as Savior and to grow in their faith. Also, please pray for the church she serves.

Welcome, New Board Members!


Karsten Dalberg


