## Pastor's corner

“The word of God shall be preached and sung!” This quote of Luther is very much applying to the joyful event of Christmas!

In 2017 we will mark 500 years since the beginning of the Lutheran Reformation, spurred by Martin Luther’s posting of the Ninety-Five Theses, so why not as an introduction to this year focus on Martin Luther’s attitude towards Christmas?

To Luther Christmas was, as it is to us too, a feast for the family, where we gather around the Christmas tree and/or the nativity scene.

Actually, according to the tradition Luther is believed to be the father of the Christmas tree!!

Again according to the tradition he is said to have seen the blinking stars through the leafless crowns of the trees. They reminded him of the celestial light and right after he saw a beautiful small green tree along the path to his home from church. He took it as a token of the coming fertility and divine Spring and resolutely he uprooted it and took it with him home where he placed it in a little bucket on the Christmas table in the parsonage and with needles he placed small candles on its branches. Here he used it to tell his children about the angels, the tree of life and the celestial light, which had entered the world.

True it is at least that the costume of indoor decorated Christmas trees *do originate from Germany and some of the earliest published*

*pictures of such trees were of Martin Luther!*

*The picture you see on the next page is by C. A. Schwerdgeburth engraved in 1845 depicting Luther at Christmas in the bosom of his family, but it not very likely Luther actually celebrated Christmas like that. .*

Because Luther felt strongly about making the Christmas tiding vivid and understandable to everyone, he appreciated if it was preached in a dramatic form and we have reports from the time of Luther of children and young people dancing around the nativity scene in churches while the adults were singing Christmas hymns. And Luther himself is said to have prepared a pageant every Christmas and sometimes even composed his own hymn for the occasion.

In 1534 maybe inspired by two of his children Hans (8 years old) and Lene (5 years old) he actually wrote such a hymn “From heaven above to earth I come”. Originally it had 15 stanzas, in Lutheran Book of Worship there are 14 and in the Danish hymnbook there are only 10 stanzas.

To begin with Luther used a popular tune, but soon he realized that the hymn needed its own tune.

The well-known melody we use today is officially assigned Schurmann, but some sources suggest that Luther himself has composed it.

The tune starts relatively high in the vocal register, depicting heaven on high as the

source of the angel's glad tidings of great joy. The tune then meanders down until it finally ends a full octave below the first note of the tune. This depicts the good news that God is quite literally down to earth in Christ.

The 1. stanza of the hymn is patterned after a text associated with a singing game where young girls with wreaths of flowers were dancing in a circle until a one of the young men present broke into the circle and sang his "wreath song" one of which went like this: *Good news from far abroad I bring, Glad tidings for you all I sing. I bring so much you'd like to know*

*Much more than I shall tell you though.*

After his singing he gave one of the girls a riddle and if she couldn't solve it, she had to give to him her flower wreath. This was a common game during the 13th century and of course Luther, who loved music and dancing, knew of it.

Now Luther uses this song tradition as a pattern for his Christmas song for children, as he calls it, and we have to visualize, that this hymn was one of the many pageant creations of Luther.

It starts with an angel entering the scene. The first stanza he is introducing himself and in the following 4 stanzas he is telling about the birth



of Jesus in Bethlehem. In the next 2 stanzas the angel encourages us to gather around the crib and then in the 8. stanza everybody gathered around the crib are welcoming the baby Jesus. The rest of the hymn is a jubilant thanksgiving for the good tiding of Christmas, but just as the music depicts the movement from heaven to earth, so is the text from stanza 10 and out playing on this incredible event that someone entitled to velvet and silk and jewels is lying in a humble manger-bed; and because Jesus was content with lying hay and straw then he shall not reject taking his dwelling in our humble hearts! By doing so we grow together with Christ and will never be parted again and that is the fantastic tiding that makes our heart leap for joy and our voices sing out loud His praise: Glory to God in the highest heaven! Who unto us His Son has given!




## Christmas Sing-along






