Pastor's Corner

The Christmas poem that follows on the next page was written by Godtfred Andersen. He was a pastor in Søllerød until his death in 1996.

I want to share it with you because, in my opinion, it is excellent and because in the single word - amazement - it strikes both bright, happy and cheerful notes and also more serious, thoughtful and demanding notes. To me at least, both kinds of notes belongs to Christmas.



One can only wonder that the birth of a little child, in a remote village in the distant past, can cause people a couple of thousand years later and thousands of kilometers away from the scene to completely change their behavior for an entire month! We “hygger”, decorate, and think about how we can please each other!

Generously, we let some extra coins fall into the cups of the beggars; we buy some more bags of dried food for the foodbank bins and people collecting money for various programs of support and relief associations rarely come in vain to our door with their raffle tickets or Christmas calendars.

We all know very well that not everyone has an equal amount of joy and happiness in their lives as we do. That is true all year round, but the birth of a little child, 2017 years ago, thousands of kilometers from here, makes us not just think but also act! So, in the midst of being busy decorating and doing our best to please the ones we hold dear, we find the energy to do something for the people who haven't got a lot to spare - and we even do that for an entire month - wonderful but strange to think about!

Today we know that the child born back then was not just any child. That Child was the Son of God, Jesus Christ, who amongst many other things said, “Whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.”. The good tidings about that Child, God's Son, has since spread around the globe and millions of people today hold this message as a beacon or guiding principle for their lives. So, based on the words of Jesus, about what we do for others we do for him, notes are being struck in us that pass the good tidings on to others.

At the birth of Jesus, Death suddenly took on a new importance!! Because, when that Child died, approximately 33 years later, death was shown to be a preparation for a new birth/resurrection. Just before Jesus died, He tried to impress this new understanding of death on his disciples. Jesus' death was not the end of His life together with His disciples. However, it was a necessary transition and transformation into what would turn out to be the entrance to an astonishingly new and rich shared life with them, and with us today too.

What an amazing gift and joy! These are thoughts that might be worth keeping in mind, now that we are facing the cold, short days of winter. And, should we lose sight of them, then we might catch sight of them if we read the following poem again.

Amazement!

Christmas is amazement from a different world.

Christmas is amazement in this world.

Christmas is amazement through and through.

Christmas is God who amazes the whole world.

That's why it's not amazing

that Christmas is the celebration

which has found the most amazing ways to express itself.

The Christmas tree is a warm amazement.

The tree of amazement.

A sign of the unthinkable - with wreaths, ribbons and stars.

A marvelous symbol of Faith and Defiance.

Amazing too that Christmas is the celebration of self-conquest,

where one tries to play at

being luminous and good,

and plays at everybody else being that as well.

Amazingly above all that, the whole world celebrates a birth

which took place in a remote province of the Mediterranean

under harsh circumstances

at a single moment in ancient times.

God made himself into a Christmas present, and, I wish to God, that we would never get over that amazement.

Over and over again, Christmas gives us reason to think differently

about God's ways and human standards.

And Christmas is an amazing occasion to amaze oneself and others.

How about amazing a human being, whom you have never written to before, with a Christmas letter?

The postman, the baker, the librarian, a neighbour or an old teacher?

A politician or a prisoner?

How about sending a flower to a person you think you hate, without any explanation?

A politician or a refugee?

A superior or a subordinate?

How about making a happy Christmas Day, despite your concerns about many things, and attend church?

How about giving Christmas amazement a chance?

This year.

Many people may wish you a happy and merry

Christmas,

A rich and roomy Christmas,

A great and lovely Christmas,

An affordable Christmas.

This is a different Christmas wish for you:

May the Lord bless you and amaze you!

our traditional Julestue will be held. Gløgg, mulled cider, æbleskiver, and European hot dogs will be available for a fee. Beautiful Christmas ornaments that weren't sold at the Bazaar can be purchased and, as something new, a table will be put up for children and their parents or grandparents to make specific kinds of Christmas tree ornaments. Later the Christmas tree for the party on December

17th will be decorated while our pastor explains why we put those specific ornaments on our Christmas trees. (After the Christmas Tree party on December 17th the children are welcome to take their ornaments for their own tree at home.)

Why weren't there any Christmas stamps at the Bazaar?

As you may have become aware of at our Christmas bazaar, DSUK (The Danish Church Abroad/Danish Seamen's Church) hasn't issued any Christmas stamps this year. Many of us now send very few Christmas cards, if any at all, so over the years less stamps have been sold. Therefore, this year DSUK has made a calendar for 2018 and we hope that this initiative will yield substantial economical support for the work of DSUK. DSUK was founded with the purpose of preserving, developing, and strengthening the National Church's efforts to serve Danish citizens who are working, studying or holidaying abroad. DSUK is also there for congregations like ours in Calgary, with members that have chosen to settle permanently in Canada but still feel a bond with Denmark and the Danish Church. Furthermore, DSUK is supporting the work of starting up new Danish churches in places where Denmark has started stationing Danes abroad, like, for example, in Dubai and China.

Mission Moments:

On Thanksgiving Sunday there was a display at the front of the Church of school kits and pneumonia vests to be sent to Canadian Lutheran World Relief. Later in the month a shipment went to Winnipeg with a grand total of 23 school kits and 181 colourful pneumonia vests. Pneumonia is a major killer of children in third world countries and these vests may save many lives. The school kits can mean that a child who receives it can go to school because they have some basic supplies. Without these things they might not be able to attend school or would have to drop out. Along with the school supplies in each kit there was also a toy which will bring happiness and fun into a child's life too. Education is life-changing and enables a person to break out of the cycle of poverty that their families have been trapped in for many generations. Thank you ladies for your generosity, time and skills which helps make the world a better place.



On the afternoon of Saturday, November 11th, fifteen children gathered in the Sunday School room to pack shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child. This is a project the children of our Church have been doing for close to 20 years and it is something that they enjoy doing immensely. This year we packed 50 boxes in about 1 ½ hours. A number of adult volunteers helped out. After the last shoebox was filled we enjoyed a delicious supper in the Church basement prepared by Margaret Propp. Then we watched the "The Peanuts Movie", which Ron Propp had set up for us. Thank you to the parents and grandparents who helped out with packing shoeboxes, cleaning up after supper, supervising children, and vacuuming up popcorn at the end of the evening. A special thanks to Tillie Olson who baked cookies to go with our dessert! A wonderful evening was had by all.

Later in November a total of 63 shoeboxes were delivered to Samaritan's Purse headquarters in NE Calgary. Our load was made up of the 50 shoeboxes packed by the children, others packed by adults from our congregation, and 3 dropped off by someone in the community. Over 11.2 million shoeboxes were collected and delivered by Samaritan's Purse International to many countries around the world in 2016. Of those, 660,000 were collected and delivered by Samaritan's Purse Canada. Thank you to everyone who bought vegetables at our fall auction, came to the medieval dinner, and gave money and/or other items for the shoeboxes. Your contributions touch the lives of many children!
